MESSAGE OF WELCOME

Dear Fellows, Members and Guests,

The summer has ended reluctantly - what a country when we are blessed with fine weather! We now turn our attention to matters academic and, for our College, the Millin Meeting is the first major set piece of the academic year.

Together with the programme committee, we have themed the meeting as 'Professionalism in a Changing Landscape'.

There is no doubt that we practice in a changed and ever-changing environment: services are now delivered by teams rather than individual practitioners; the framework of our Health Service seems to be repeatedly reconstructed; we practice with constrained resources under increased scrutiny and with a duty of candour, in a context of intolerance of imperfect outcomes; and with a looming crisis in indemnity insurance.

The meeting will open with two major sessions in the morning: The first session - 'Medical Professionalism - Buzzwords or Basics?' will address the expectations of our regulator, methods of inculcating professionalism into our trainees and promoting it in our colleagues. The second session - 'HSE Health Service Re-engineering...Again' addresses concepts and issues which will have a major impact on our working lives and should engender lively discussion.

The afternoon begins with the Carmichael Lecture and we are all looking forward to hearing from David Walsh, Chief Sports Writer with The Sunday Times and multi-winner of Sports Writer of the Year. His talk is entitled: 'Winning is not all that Matters'.

The Carmichael Lecture is followed by sessions addressing the crisis in medical indemnity cover and the responsibilities of the doctor in the era of multi-disciplinary care and then the Keynote Lecture by Professor Norman S. Williams, entitled 'Attempts to Innovate in Coloproctology - Lessons Learnt'.

Finally, following the conferring of the Honorary Fellowship on Professor Williams, we have the highlight of the meeting, the Millin Lecture, 'The Evolving Treatment Paradigm of Thyroid Cancer', which will be delivered by Professor James Paul O'Neill, a dynamic, academic surgeon and Chair of Otolaryngology, Head & Neck Surgery, RCSI.

At the conclusion of the Millin Lecture, there will be a drinks reception in the Board Room to which everyone is welcome.

It is my privilege to welcome you to what we believe will be a wonderful meeting, and I look forward to meeting you in the College.

ABOUT OUR HONORARY FELLOW



Professor Norman Williams is Professor of Surgery at Barts and The London, Queen Mary's School of Medicine and Dentistry and Director of the National Centre for Bowel Research and Surgical Innovation. His main clinical interests are sphincter preservation and reconstructive colorectal surgery, and his scientific interests are concentrated on GI motility and anorectal physiology.

He has been President of the Society of Academic & Research Surgery, President of The Ileostomy & Internal Pouch Support Group, Chairman of the UKCCCR committee on Colorectal Cancer, President of European Digestive Surgery, President of The International Surgical Group and Vice Chairman of The British Journal of Surgery. From 2011-14, he was President of the Royal College of Surgeons of England.

Professor Williams is joint editor of Bailey and Love's Short Practice of Surgery, co-author of Surgery of the Anus, Rectum and Colon and is a founding trustee and Chairman of Bowel & Cancer Research. He was a Fulbright Scholar (1980-82) and was awarded the Patey Prize of the

SRS (1978), the Moynihan Travelling Fellowship (1985), the Society of Authors Prize (Jointly 1995), the Nessim Habib Prize, University of Geneva (1995), the Galen Medal of the Worshipful Company of Apothecaries (2003) and the Cutler's Surgical Prize (2011). He is a Fellow of the Academy of Medical Sciences, the Royal College of Physicians of London and Edinburgh, and the Royal College of Anaesthetists. He is an Honorary Fellow of The American Surgical Association, The American College of Surgeons, the German Society of General and Visceral Surgery, the American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons, the Brazilian College of Surgeons and the Society of General Surgeons of Peru.

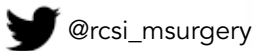
