MESSAGE OF WELCOME



It is early February once more and we come together for our Charter Day celebrations over three days. This year marks the 231st Anniversary of our Foundation on 11th February 1784 when George III bestowed his Royal Charter, a facsimile of which can be seen in our Front Hall.

The weekend begins with a number of events on Thursday, firstly the Scientific Session of NASCE (Network for Clinical Skills Centres in Europe) followed by the 25th Annual Video Surgery meeting, organised by Professor Tom Walsh and the 9th Annual Intercollegiate Case Presentations Competition.

The main Scientific Meeting on Friday 6th February begins with parallel sessions in the morning related to Breast & Plastic Surgery, Innovations in Surgery, Otolaryngology Head & Neck Surgery and Trauma & Orthopaedic Surgery. We are indebted to Margaret O'Donnell & Malcolm Kell; Tom Gorey & Sean Carroll; John Fenton & Tadhg O'Dwyer; John O'Byrne & James Cashman; Ken Mealy & Paul McCormick for organising and chairing these sessions.

Immediately after lunch, we will be treated to the Johnson & Johnson Lecture, to be delivered by Dr Carolanne Moulton, Associate Professor and Staff Surgeon, University of Toronto, entitled "The Vulnerability of the Surgeon in Shining Armour".

The Johnson & Johnson Lecture will be followed by my Presidential Address in which I will hope to update the Fellows & Members on the activities of the College in the areas of surgical training, education and practice – as well as highlighting some of the achievements of the College over the past year.

The main session of the meeting will follow after a coffee break as a Plenary Session entitled "Structuring definitive care for trauma patients; now is the time" and will be chaired by David Moore and Fergal Hickey. There is an increasing recognition that there are better ways to structure and deliver trauma services in this country and it is hoped that this session will encourage a healthy and robust discussion which will be an important contributor to this important national debate.

A further highlight will be the 90th Abraham Colles Lecture, delivered by Professor Stan J. Monstrey, Ghent University Hospital, Belgium, entitled "Gender Reassignment Surgery: What is new?". The Friday meeting will conclude with a reception in the Boardroom.


On Saturday, the Irish Higher Surgical Training Group will host their annual meeting which is themed around the incorporation of new procedures into practice. The Bosco O'Mahony Lecture, entitled "Life Long Learning" will be delivered by Professor Pierce Grace, Consultant Vascular Surgeon, University Hospital Limerick.

Later on Saturday we look forward to conferring Honorary Fellowships on Professor Patrick G. Johnston, President & Vice Chancellor of Queen's University Belfast and Professor Stan J. Monstrey, Professor and Chairman, Department of Plastic Surgery, Ghent University Hospital, Belgium and this will be followed by our Annual Charter Day dinner and I hope to see many of you there.

Finally I wish to thank Eunan Friel, Sean Tierney, Louise Loughran, Cara McVeigh, Aoife Congdon, Sonja Lee, and Kate Smith for their enormous help in devising and structuring this programme of events.

Carol-anne Moulton graduated from The University of Melbourne, Melbourne Australia in 1992 and completed general surgical training earning certification from the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons in 2001. She undertook several Fellowships following this including a Fellowship in Upper Gastrointestinal and Laparoscopic Surgery at St. Vincents Hospital in Melbourne, a Fellowship in Hepato-Pancreatico-Biliary (HPB) Surgery at Toronto General Hospital, and a Surgical Education Fellowship at the University of Toronto, earning a Master's of Higher Education in 2006 and a PhD in 2010. She is an Associate Professor in the Department of Surgery and the Director of the HPB Fellowship Program at the University of Toronto. In early 2010, Dr Moulton became a Scientist at the Wilson Centre at the University of Toronto, and she is the recipient of the Early Researcher Award from

the Ministry of Research and Innovation. Her research has been supported by the Medical Council of Canada, the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, and Physicians' Services Incorporated. Dr Moulton's research program focuses on understanding the complexity of surgical judgment, the development of surgical expertise, and underlying causes of surgeon error.



90th ABRAHAM COLLES LECTURE

Professor Stan J. Monstrey, MD, PhD, FCCP, FRCS (Eng)

Stan J. Monstrey attended medical school at the State University of Gent where he graduated in 1980 'Magna cum Laude'. Thereafter, he did four years of General Surgery residency at the University Hospital in Nijmegen, The Netherlands, followed by four years of residency in Plastic Surgery back at the University Hospital in Gent. He qualified as an attending Plastic Surgeon in 1988 and in that same year he obtained his PhD degree at the University in Nijmegen, The Netherlands with a thesis entitled: 'Trauma to the Urinary System'. From 1988-1989, he was attending Consultant Plastic Surgeon at the Academic Hospital of the Free University in Brussels and the following two years he went to the University of Pittsburgh (Pennsylvania, USA) for a research fellowship (as Fullbright scholar) and also for a clinical fellowship in Hand Surgery and Microsurgery.

In 1991 he went back to Belgium where he first became Assistant Professor, later Associate Professor and finally Full Professor and Chairman (1995) from the Department of Plastic Surgery at the Ghent University Hospital. He has been President of the Belgian Association for Burn Injuries (1998 – 2003), Secretary General of the European Association of Plastic Surgeons (EURAPS) from 2001 to 2007, President of the World Professional Association of Transgender Health (WPATH; 2005 – 2007), and also President of the Royal Belgian Society of the Royal Belgian Society of Plastic Surgery (2010-2012).

Stan J. Monstrey is co-author and/or author of 265 peer reviewed articles, 14 book chapters. He is (co)-editor of seven books and gave in total more than 600 scientific presentations.
